### Registration Information For Students Who Did Not Early Register

1. Study the 1975 Spring Schedule and the courses required for the major. Select a tentative program.
2. Check the list of closed classes printed elsewhere in this paper.
3. Meet with your advisor and plan your schedule. If you do not know your advisor, contact the Dean of Students' Office or the Registrar's Office in the Administration Building. Complete the course study card and the three - part schedule sheet. (Advisor will have these.) Be sure to copy the schedule number correctly as this is the number that the computer uses to put you in the class that you request.
4. Important: Courses that are to be taken under Audit or Credit - No Credit status must be designated as AU or CR - NC respectively. These should be approved by your advisor or his representative. If you are repeating a course in which you previously earned an F or a D, you must designate same by (R).
5. Seniors who are planning to student teach this semester must notify the Chairman of the Education Department (Room 122 in the Zehmer Building) and have him or his representative initial the course study card.
6. Take the course study card and one copy of the schedule sheet to the Registrar's Office. Wait to be sure that all of the classes that you requested are still open.
7. Pay fees.

 (c) Take the form to your advisor for his - her approval and signature.  
 (d) For ADDS only - take the form to the instructor of each class added and obtain his - her signature in the appropriate place. (English courses added require the approval of the chairman of the English Department in addition to the instructor).  
 (e) When all signatures have been obtained, return the form to the Office of the Dean of the College for approval and then to the Registrar's Office.  
 - (f) A fee of \$1.00 is charged for each course change. All such fees collected are deposited as special funds revenues used in the operation of the college.  
 The important dates for adding and dropping courses during the Spring 1975 semester are:  
 Last Day For Adding A New Course (or Changing to Credit - No Credit) - Wednesday, January 29  
 Last Day For Dropping A Course With A Grade of "W" - Friday, April 11  
 -If you decide to make a change in your schedule which will not alter your status as a full - time or part - time student (full - time equals 12 hours and above; part - time equals 11 hours and below), please go ahead and pay fees. Schedule change forms will not be accepted in the Registrar's Office until January 23 rd unless the change does alter the student's status resulting in a change in the amount of tuition and fees; these changes will, of course, be accepted immediately.  
 The fee of \$1.00 per course change will become effective Monday, January 27th.
